This line comes towards the end of our Creed, which we say together every week. The word 'catholic' here does not mean 'Roman Catholic' but is used in its original meaning which is 'everyone' - a holy church for 'all'.

The word 'apostolic' relates to the succession of spiritual authority from the 12 Apostles. As Church of England (Anglicans) this succession, we believe, has come down from the Apostles through our Bishops since then.

I always look for new challenges and new beginnings and I enjoy new challenges in and outside of the church.


#### If I can help, I will.

# Rev's End

#### **Hello Holy Savs!**

Last month, I went on a wonderful day's course on 'mindfulness' organised by Bishop Jonathan for all the priests in the Croydon Episcopal area. It was led, very well, by Rev. Tim Stead from Oxford. Although mindfulness is not specifically Christian, as taught in the mainstream, it does link with age old Christian meditation and contemplative practices and the day was dedicated to Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Mindfulness and Christian Meditation are both widely practised nowadays and have much in common.

We are all aware of the stress and bustle of modern life and seek some escape into a state of peace or freedom from stress.



Luke 12.22: He said to his disciples, 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat, or about your body, what you will wear.' In mindfulness, which has its roots in all the major faiths, the central insight is that we are bigger than our thoughts and feelings; our thoughts are just events in our minds.

We can observe our thoughts and feelings and de-centre from them. We might want to say from a Christian perspective that they are part of us, but they are not us.



#### Mindfulness has its roots in all the major faiths

We learn not to react so automatically to our thoughts but begin to respond compassionately. Here we are following the teaching of Jesus. We are called to 'leave self behind' or 'deny ourselves'. This is what we are doing in mindfulness and meditation, leaving behind the small egotistical mind and our obsession with our sense of self, in order to find the fullness of being to which the practice opens us.



Our thoughts and feelings are often shaped by our culture into narcissistic, competitive, fearful or consumerist patterns. Instead, we follow Jesus, who was able to say: 'The Father and I are One'. This is a spiritual practice. By stilling the mind, we become open to our own spirit and the creator spirit of God.

The practice of Mindfulness and Meditation (M & M) can bring many benefits to your Emotional & Physical health, as well as to the Relationships in your life.

Mindfulness and Meditation (M & M) are amazing tools for stress management and overall wellness because it can be used at virtually any time of the day and can quickly bring results. Mindfulness and Meditation (M & M) can pull you out of the

negative downward spiral that can be caused by too much daily stress, too many bad moods, or the habit of rumination. It can build resilience to stress so you're less stressed in the future while it helps you to shrug off present stress.

In Romans 12:2, Paul tells us, 'Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind...'

On Tuesday evenings 7.3opm-8.3opm, we combine Night Prayer with Mindfulness Meditation.
