

Trip To To Lake Orta, Italy

Ron and I had the good fortune to spend a week in Orta San Giulio, the only town on Lake Orta. Town is hardly the word for a maze of cobbled streets, tiny shops, cafes and a lake front with boats travelling to the island of San Giulio.

After a long day on trains and coaches, we spent our first day relaxing, walking



down to the town from our hotel and people-watching by the lake. The swimming pool was a cool invitation for some gentle exercise.

Saturday, we had a coach outing to Stresa on Lake Maggiore and then into Switzerland to Locarno. Unfortunately, it poured with rain all day so the shops beckoned. I even bought a new umbrella.

Sunday, the sun was back and we decided to walk to the Sacro Monte di Orta which is over 300 feet above the

lake. This is a UNESCO site and is an area of natural beauty where 20 chapels, each decorated with frescoes and life size terracotta statues telling the story of St. Francis of Assisi's life, have been built. St. Francis was chosen as the subject of the Sacro Monte because his life shows a close resemblance to the life of Christ, in as much as his mother's pregnancy being announced by an angel, his birth in a stable, choice of a life of poverty and preaching, stigmata and the devil's temptations. The chapels were built over a period of more than 100 years so the styles of architecture vary greatly. This was a place of tranquillity and prayer, a meeting with God in a garden.

Monday, we visited Lake Como. First we went into the cathedral in Como, then along the lake to the Villa Carlotta, where the gardens are stunning and the museum interesting. We then went into Switzerland again to Locarno where we had tea and cakes in the Coop. It was then back for a quick swim before dinner. It was then back for a quick swim before dinner. Tuesday was a coach trip to Milan, where we spent a long time wandering around the magnificent cathedral. The architecture was truly amazing and the stained glass and floor tiles really magnificent. This was very much a place of worship despite the number of tourists. Security here was very tight after the killing of a priest in France. Full body searches, very reassuring! After a pizza in the square, there was time to window gaze in the Galleria where all the exclusive shops are.

On our last day, we went for a walk and had a trip on the road train before some last minute shopping and peoplewatching while eating the fantastic ice cream of Italy.

Born in Jamaica on 25th November 1908 and passed away on 13th August 2016 in Thornton Heath, Surrey.



Residents (including church members), Veolia and the Council (including the leader of the Council, Councillor Tony Newman) all met together to focus on the fly-tipping problem in this area.

Bensham Manor Ward, and Linda Watson of Thornton Heath Community Action Team (THCAT) for their support. Thanks also go to our Sheri for taking the minutes; Redva, Lilian, Dan and Ron for helping to set up; Alison for serving refreshments; and to all those Holy Savs who came to the meeting.

The very fact that the meeting took place was a very good start. 75 people attended on what was a normal working morning. The Veolia operatives were particularly pleased to be invited and it was good to hear their point of view. Four topics were discussed, all relevant to the issue of flytipping: Responsibilities of Landlords; Bulky waste collection; communicating easily with the Council; and Street Champions.

Lamentations of Jeremiah 3.45:

You have made us filth and <u>rubbish</u> among the peoples.



It was acknowledged that the state of our local streets with respect to litter and flytipping is unacceptable and a CRISIS. A tangible result of the meeting was a commitment from the Council to continue the telephone fly-tipping hotline number, which had been going to be phased out. There was also a commitment from all parties to meet again in two months' time and continue the three-way conversation. Communication and awareness from Council to Residents was also considered a priority.

An area that is heavily littered or flytipped gives the perception of increased crime levels and safety concerns. It also encourages others to dump their rubbish there. Fly-tipping costs hundreds of thousands of pounds in clearance charges each year; money that ultimately comes out of council tax payers' pockets.
