The evening culminated with Indian dancing. These young aspiring professional dancers demonstrated rhythms filled with accuracy and


precision. These were themed dances and movements with strong messages of hope, love and working together (unity). This performance was filled with awe and wonder.

Hello Holy Savs!

"... the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, support, strengthen, and establish you" 1 Peter 5.10

The long awaited works to restore our church hall floor have begun! This has been a long process from discussion to actuality by the Building & Finance Team and our PCC.

The restoration of our Church Hall Floor

The orange linoleum was laid down in the hall at the time of the 're-ordering' in 1999 when the division of the back third of the church from the south porch to the west door with narthex and tower was created into what was then called a 'community facility', we know it as the 'church hall'. The previous church hall having been on the site of the now Vicarage (but it was sadly burnt down in a fire).

The upper gallery was also created at that time. In 2014 parts of the orange lino had to be removed (for complex reasons which I won't go into!) and the initial idea was simply to re-lay some new orange lino – BUT – when we saw the lovely old floor boards and tiles that were revealed a suggestion that we restore the hall floor to its original state, particularly as a lot of the orange lino had become very faded.

'Salt is good; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be *restored?'* Luke 14.34:

Our Archdeacon and Architect were consulted and in January 2015 the idea had taken off the PCC passed a resolution in support of the works to be funded by the kind legacy

given by Fr John Worsfold, a past priest at Holy Saviour. A 'faculty' (church planning permission) had to be applied for and we were delighted when on 19 July 2016 the faculty was granted by the Chancellor of Southwark Diocese.

The works have been carried out by Fine Wooden Flooring Ltd - you can see their picture!

The restoration will increase the beauty of our church and restore our history to us (and increase the hall's rental value!). Thanks must go to our Building and Finance Team. Perhaps we can reflect on how God restores us too:





You who have made me see many troubles and calamities will revive me again; from the depths of the earth you will bring me up again. Psalm 71:20

For those who have been through difficult times, we are reminded that God will use these down times to shape us and will restore us, because this is His nature. In fact, nothing you have been through will go to waste. And... God uses each one of us in His restoration of each other and how we need each other as members of the Body of Christ.
