
COLLECT FOR THE DAY

FIRST READING: Amos 5: 21-24 - Murnell

²¹ I hate, I despise your festivals, and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies. ²² Even though you offer me your burnt offerings and grain offerings, I will not accept them, and the offerings of well-being of your fatted animals I will not look upon. ²³ Take away from me the noise of your songs; I will not listen to the melody of your harps. ²⁴ But let justice roll down like water and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.

PSALM 146: 4-10



⁴ Blessed is he that hath the God of Jacob ' for his ' help: and whose hope is ' in the ' Lord his ' God; ⁵ Who made heaven and earth, the sea and all that ' therein ' is: who ' keepeth his ' promise for ' ever. ⁶ Who helpeth them to right that ' suffer ' wrong: who ' feed 'eth the ' hungry. ⁷ The Lord looseth men ' out of ' prison: the Lord giveth ' sight ' to the ' blind. ⁸ The Lord helpeth ' them that are ' fallen: the Lord ' careth ' for the ' righteous. ⁹ The Lord careth for the strangers, he defendeth the ' fatherless and ' widow: as for the way of the ungodly he ' turneth it ' upside ' down. ¹⁰ The Lord thy God O Sion, shall be King for ' ever'more: and through'out all 'gene'rations.

We <u>remain seated</u> for the concluding doxology: Glory be to the Father and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be: world without end. Amen

SECOND READING: Romans 8: 18-25 - Sarah

¹⁸ I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. ¹⁹ For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God, ²⁰ for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be set free from its enslavement to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²² We know that the whole creation has been groaning together as it suffers together the pains of labour, ²³ and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope, for who hopes for what one already sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

GOSPEL - Matthew 5. 1-12 -

- ¹When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. ² And he began to speak and taught them, saying:
- ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ⁴ "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- ⁵ "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.
- ⁶ "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- ⁷ "Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.
- ⁸ "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
- ⁹ "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- ¹⁰ "Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ¹¹ "Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account.
- ¹² Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.
