FIRST READING: Isaiah 9: 1-7 – Sarah

1 But there will be no gloom for those who were in anguish. In the former time he brought into contempt the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the latter time he will make glorious the way of the sea, the land beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the nations.

- ² The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;
- those who lived in a land of deep darkness-
- on them light has shined.
- ³ You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy;

they rejoice before you

as with joy at the harvest,

as people exult when dividing plunder.

- ⁴ For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian.
- ⁵ For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire.
- ⁶ For a child has been born for us, a son given to us;
- authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named
- Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
- ⁷ His authority shall grow continually,

and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onwards and for evermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

- 1 BLESSED be the Lord'God of 'Israel : for he hath'visited and re-'deemed his' people;
- 2 And hath raised up a mighty sal'vation' for us : in the 'house of his 'servant' David;
- 3 As he spake by the mouth of his'holy' Prophets : which have been 'since the' world be'gan;
- 4 That we should be saved ' from our ' enemies : and from the ' hands of ' all that ' hate us;
- 5 To perform the mercy promised 'to our' forefathers : and to re-'member his' holy' Covenant;
- 6 To perform the oath which he sware to our fore father Abraham : that 'he would 'give 'us;
- 7 That we being delivered out of the 'hand of our 'enemies : might 'serve him with'out ' fear;
 - 8 In holiness and 'righteousness be'fore him : all the 'days of 'our' life.
 - 9 And thou Child shalt be called the 'Prophet of the 'Highest : for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord ' to pre'pare his ' ways;

SECOND READING: Philippians 1: 3-11 – Lilian

³ I thank my God for every remembrance of you, ⁴ always in every one of my prayers for all of you, praying with joy ⁵ for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. ⁶ I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ. ⁷ It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because I hold you in my heart, for all of you are my partners in God's grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel.⁸ For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the tender affection of Christ Jesus.⁹ And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight ¹⁰ to help you to determine what really matters, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, ¹¹ having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

GOSPEL – Luke 3: 1-6 – Marie

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, ² during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. ³ He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, ⁴ as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight. ⁵ Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, ⁶ and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'"
